

## **SAFE DATE COLORADO SAFETY POLICY**

**Effective Date: March 3, 2026**

This Colorado Safety Policy applies to users located in the State of Colorado and is provided in accordance with applicable Colorado law.

Safe Date is committed to promoting respectful interactions and user safety. This Policy describes certain safety practices and user responsibilities.

---

### **1. Identity Verification and Screening**

Safe Date may use identity verification tools and third-party screening services to promote user safety.

However:

- We do not conduct comprehensive background investigations of every user.
- Screening processes may not identify all criminal history or misconduct.
- No verification process is foolproof.

Users should not rely solely on platform verification measures when deciding to interact with others.

---

### **2. User Responsibilities**

Users are responsible for:

- Providing accurate profile information.
- Exercising caution when communicating or meeting with others.
- Reporting suspicious, harmful, or inappropriate behavior.

When meeting someone in person, users are encouraged to:

- Meet in public places.
  - Inform a trusted contact of their plans.
  - Avoid sharing sensitive personal information prematurely.

### **3. Reporting and Moderation**

Safe Date provides reporting tools within the Service that allow users to report:

- Harassment
- Threats
- Fraud
- Impersonation
- Violations of Community Guidelines

We may investigate reported conduct and may suspend or terminate accounts where appropriate.

### **4. Cooperation with Law Enforcement**

Safe Date may cooperate with law enforcement authorities as required by law, including responding to valid legal requests.

---

### **5. Limitations**

Safe Date provides a platform for user interaction but does not supervise in-person meetings.

Safe Date does not guarantee:

- The identity of any user.

- The accuracy of user-provided information.
- The behavior or intentions of users.

Users interact at their own discretion and risk.

For non-emergency assistance in Colorado, users may contact appropriate local authorities or victim support organizations.
